ALL pupils leaving primary school **physically literate** and with the **knowledge, skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy, active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport.

The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following Objective and Indicators:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. increased participation in competitive sport

It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must be sustainable and leave a lasting legacy beyond the funding allocation

Indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles

Objective	Key Actions	Allocated funding	Anticipated outcomes
Give pupils access to a more varied PE curriculum.	Use of the field (grass pitch) at Surrey Street School to increase the range of sports offered in PE throughout the year (Sports Day etc)	£500	Pupils have access to a more varied curriculum encouraging them to take part in regular physical activity.
Pupils to have more specialist support in their physical education lessons.	Employ a PE technician.	£9000	This will help the PE lead teacher when teaching lessons. The technician will be able to support pupils at all learning stages to enable them to become more confident in physical education.
Gather a detailed view of the sports played by our pupils outside of schools and also gain more knowledge of pupil's activity levels.	PE leads to devise a healthy life style questionnaire.	£ 150	Staff will be able to provide a more tailored approach to PE lessons and extra-curricular clubs. This will enable children to enjoy lessons and make better progress.

Objective	Key Actions	Allocated funding	Anticipated outcomes
Introduction of house games.	Pupils to have regular house competitions in school – football, netball, cricket, dodgeball, tri golf. Pupils awarded trophies/medals for their performance.	£500	Pupils will have a sense of pride and achievement in representing their house in competitions. A lasting legacy of house sports will be created.

Indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching Physical Education and sport

Objective	Key Actions	Allocated funding	Anticipated outcomes
CPD for PE staff	PE specialists to attend the primary PE conference. PE specialists to attend relevant courses for their CPD	£1000	Teachers become more confident in the teaching of PE. Teachers have the chance to gain more knowledge in the teaching of PE.
Develop stronger links with PE facilitators in the local community	PE staff to attend regular PE network meetings	£500 (supply)	Up to date with current developments in local area – increased opportunities for involvement with Interschool sports
Pupils to develop ability to self evaluate performance during PE sessions and so develop skills.	Purchase Ipad for recording sessions during PE and then to use for further coaching sessions	£300	Improved skills and techniques. Clearer assessment – upload to school assessment tracker

Indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

Objective	Key Actions	Allocated funding	Anticipated outcomes
Introduce Golf across the school. Purchase tri golf equipment for the school PE lessons and extra-curricular clubs.	All KS2 pupils to get the opportunity to play golf. Most pupils in KS1 to get the opportunity to play golf.	£250	Broaden pupil's knowledge of different sports during their time at primary school.
Introduce Archery to the school.	Pupils in year 5 and 6 to have archery introduced into their PE curriculum.	£600	Children from all backgrounds to get the opportunity to learn about archery thus broadening their experience of sports.

Create football teams across the school to compete in the Luton school leagues.	Purchase two goals for the pupils to be able to play matches at home. Purchase football kits for the teams. Purchase football equipment balls, bibs and cones to help with training.	£500	Children from across the key stages will have the opportunity to represent the school at football. Children will learn valuable life lessons about team work and cooperation by having this opportunity.
More access to basketball across the key stages. Create a more inclusive scheme of work for basketball. Increase differentiation in this sport.	Purchase a range of floor and portable basketball nets to encourage more basketball to be taught in lessons and played at lunchtimes.	£1500	More pupils will be able to have high quality basketball lessons. Pupils will have access to another sport at break times decreasing negative incidents.

Provide a curriculum that is accessible for all pupils – increase level of involvement for those pupils less physically active	Purchase Boccia set and attend local events	£100	SEND Pupils have increased/enhanced access to the PE curriculum – greater opportunity to take part in a recognized competitive sport
Develop upper body strength and enhance sporting provision during break times in school	Source and erect traversing walls to suit all ages and abilities	£500	Children develop greater upper body and core strength

Objective	Key Actions	Allocated funding	Anticipated outcomes
School Games Active Luton Sports Partnership Events attendance.	Attend more sports events across the town. Supply teachers to cover lessons for PE staff across the year.	£1500	PE specialists able to both train and lead teams at the school games competitions without too much disruption to school pe lessons.
Having reliable transport to get us to and from sports competitions.	Alongside the Vale Academy to maintain the mini bus so it can be used for events. Supply alternative transport for events if the minibuses are booked.	£1500	Increased participation in the school games.
