## Theme

Our theme this term is based around the novel 'Refugee Boy' by Benjamin Zephaniah. The book tells the story of Alem, a young boy with an Ethiopian father and Eritrean mother, who is left alone in London and needs all his courage as he faces up to the British justice system. In this topic we will be learning about the human and physical geography of Africa and will be learning to use 4 and 6 figure grid references. We will create African art using the technique of Batik and will learn and create music involving African drumming and based on African pop music. We will also discuss what it means to be a refugee and will debate the moral choices facing Alem and the British authorities in the story.
