# <u>Theme</u>

This half term, the creative theme is the Vikings. Study will focus on who they were and how they lived. We will practise out DT skills by making our own Viking longships and helmets as well as exploring Viking artefacts. We will also be scrutinising historical claims, discussing the source of each piece of information and analysing how reliable it is. In addition, geographic knowledge

will be tested as we study where the Vikings came from and their reason for settling in the British Isles.

This topic will run for the entire half term in order to give the children an opportunity to immerse themselves in the curriculum and develop their understanding of what it may have felt like, to be a Viking.
